PATRICK BOWE is a garden historian and designer who has written or co-written nine books on garden history. His latest book, *Gardens of the Roman World* – an account of gardens in ancient Rome – was published by the J. Paul Getty Museum, California. One of his principal design projects has been at Sutton Place, England, former home of J. Paul Getty.

NESTA BUTLER completed a PhD on ‘William Baillie (1723-1810): printmaker, connoisseur and dealer’ at University College Dublin in 2005.

ROB GOODBODY is a historic building consultant. He is author of three books and a number of other published works, including contributions to the *Oxford Dictionary of National Biography*.
