## Authors' biographies

PATRICK BOWE is an architect, a garden designer and a historian. He is author or coauthor of nine books, including three on Irish gardens and *Gardens of Portugal*, *Gardens of Central Europe* and *Gardens of the Caribbean*.

ANA DOLAN is a conservation architect with Dúchas, the Heritage Service. Seven of the twelve churches studied in the research for her article are National Monuments in State care.
